WHY I ENJOY BEING A BEFRIENDER

"I enjoy being a Befriender because it gives me the opportunity to offer time and conversation to someone whose life can be very restricted by health problems, including mobility.

We do various things while I am with her and I just join in with what she wants to do that day. If there is a crossword puzzle to finish, a gadget to sort out or a birthday card to be bought for a grandchild, that is what we do. It often appears that nothing has been achieved but time will tell."

"Bexley Evergreen seemed such a good example of how God can use his followers, however insignificant, to accomplish His work. Would this initial view be challenged by the experience? No!

My wife and I have been visiting a lady for nearly five months. We visit on a weekly basis spending two hours each time. There have been gaps where illness has inevitably disrupted the visits and our first topic of conversation is normally to chat about health issues and treatments. The remainder of the two hours seem to fly as we talk over hobbies and interests.

We would definitely recommend this voluntary work to others so that they may experience for themselves this enjoyable and rewarding initiative."

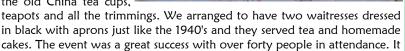


"MEMORIES" AN AFTERNOON TEA FROM THE BYGONE ERA—16TH JULY 2014
